Generation III Extended Cold Weather Clothing System (ECWCS)



System Description:

- A multi-component, versatile clothing system that allows the Soldier to adapt to mission requirements and environmental conditions
- Designed to be used in several possible layered configurations
- 12 different components issued as follows:
 - 2 x Lightweight Cold Weather Undershirts/Drawers
 - 1 x Mid-weight Cold Weather Shirt/Drawers
 - 1 x Fleece Cold Weather Jacket
 - 1 x Wind Cold Weather Jacket
 - 1 x Soft Shell Cold Weather Jacket/Trousers
 - 1 x Extreme Cold/Wet Weather Jacket/Trousers
 - 1 x Extreme Cold Weather Parka/Trousers

Objective: Improve Soldier acceptance in form, fit, function in field and garrison environment, and improve compatibility with body armor

BOI: One per deploying Soldier

NSN: Available by component



ECWCS P3I



- Define and incorporate flame and thermal protection
 - Baseline FR performance is equal to the Flame Resistant (FR) Army Combat Uniform (ACU) vertical flame and tpp performance
- FR capability will be added into the soft shell coat and trouser
 - This will be done as a change through the current ECWCS contract and possibly implemented into sustainment contracts
